



More than a building site— WESS selected as a Spotlight School!

WESS is now a Spotlight School for the Early Years! We have been recognised for our excellence in transition to school and our teaching practice during the early years, and we are now looked upon as a leading school in this area.

Each of the 7 regions across the state selected one school, and WESS was selected for the Metropolitan Region!!

New library design—incorporating nature into learning

We value our green spaces and the joy and sense of well-being that immersing in nature promotes. Compassion is a WESS value—compassion for nature reflects this and also reflects the values of our wider community.

The second library in the link building, linking L-block with the Yr 5 & 6 building, will house more than 2,000 books, revealing thousands of stories to WESS students. The nature design for the library was inspired by libraries internationally that have incorporated real and figurative nature themes. The new WESS library will include

- 2 large bookshelf trees
- specially designed spaces for living plants
- flexible furniture, on wheels
- 2 teaching spaces that can reconfigure to a large space
- large, multipurpose space
- 'private' nooks and crannies to curl up with a book or share one with a friend
- storage
- display space to promote more books and a greater love of reading.

The current K-block library and the new link building library will operate as 2 library locations serving as the WESS library. Both locations will hold lessons and have borrowing times, and students can borrow and return from either location.


We hope the link building library location joins our K-block library to become a much-loved space where everyone feels welcome at any time.

P&C contributions—how you've helped the building works


Each year, WESS P&C contributes to the school and thanks to the contributions of the hundreds of volunteers who assist the P&C and all P&C staff, this year the P&C will also contribute \$300,000 to the building works. These funds will go towards

- 100sqm P&C administrative space including office, business and community meeting room
- much-needed larger uniform shop
- commercial kitchen / canteen fitted with commercial-grade appliances such as a 10-tray combi oven and a

4-gas burner/oven, passthrough dishwasher, and coffee machine. The new commercial kitchen / canteen will be located in the Performing Arts Complex.

The P&C supports WESS through the operation of the

- Outside School Hours Care (OSHC)
- tuckshop (current and the new Performing Arts Complex kitchen and canteen)
- uniform shop
- · swim club and after school swimming lessons
- tennis courts
- 'FUNdraising activities to support the school.

As well as the P&C's investment in infrastructure and the school's growth, the P&C will continue to provide resources and facilities including

- the annual IT device support
- student reading materials
- new bike/scooter racks
- oval maintenance and groundkeeping support
- swimming pool equipment (pool cover, heating blanket, lane ropes)
- in-class swim coach assistance.

The P&C will also support the WESS Stage 2 delivery and ongoing school infrastructure investment beyond 2021.

It's a jungle out there and our school is too overgrown for our groundskeepers to upkeep WESS.






